


Display Your Signs with Optimal Visibility

A sign is only effective if it can be seen. Place your sign in the right location so people can easily see and read it. It is important that your sign is mounted in the proper “sightline” or region of optimal visibility. Signs are best viewed at a 90-degree angle to the viewer. To create a proper line of sight, the baseline of the lowest tactile characters on a sign shall be at least 48 inches from the floor or ground surface, and the baseline of the highest tactile characters shall not exceed 60 inches from the floor or ground surface. For a door mounted sign, its centerline should be 60” from the floor.

Install Your Sign in 5 Easy Steps

- 1** Remove old, damaged or outdated signs.
- 2** Measure and mark the minimum height (48”) and the maximum height (60”) from the floor on the wall, a door, or other mounting surfaces.
- 3** Make sure the baseline of the lowest tactile characters is at or above the 48” mark and the baseline of the highest tactile characters is at or below the 60” mark. If the sign will be mounted on a door, its centerline should sit at the 60” mark.
- 4** Use a level to straighten the sign on the mounting surface of your choice.
- 5** Mount the sign via adhesive backing or other desired mechanical fasteners.



Helpful Reminders

- Signs should be installed in the line of sight and not be obscured by doors, racks or other objects.
- Installation should be in a well-lit and easily accessible location.
- Where light levels are poor, the signs should incorporate artificial lighting.
- Safety Signs should be placed near the associated hazard, but they should not create a distraction nor be placed so that they also become hazard.
- Signs should not be placed on moveable objects or adjacent to moveable objects like doors, windows, and drawers, which if opened or moved, will obscure the sign.
- Faded, degraded, outdated, or damaged signs should be replaced immediately.
